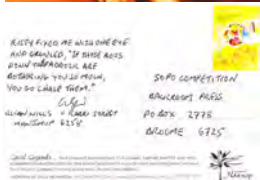
CORRUGATED LINES

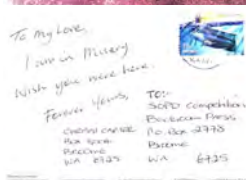
Last year BP ran four successful events, with Di Morrissey as our high-profile author.
